Self-educated in criminal law & organizing during his 27 years at Angola State Penitentiary, Norris now directs this grassroots & policy organization dedicated to transforming New Orleans' brutal criminal justice system.

Convicted and sentenced to death when he was 16 for a New Orleans murder he did not commit, Shareef spent 4 years on Death Row and another before the Louisiana Supreme Court overturned his conviction. Now 27, Shareef is an organizer with Fairness for Prisoners Families in Atlanta and a full time student at Morehouse College.
